Scope & Content

The collection of 10 ledgers contains the accounts of the patients of Dr. T. C. Miller of New Hope, VA for some years between 1904 and 1920 inclusive. Each ledger is indexed. The account for each patient shows the type of visit and medications dispensed along with the fee charged for each. An accounting of payments is also included. The 14 daybooks span the years 1904 to 1911. They contain a running day-by-day account of each patient seen and services provided. The other items in the collection are an assortment of items found between pages of the ledgers such as prescription forms, invoice from a drug company, a brochure for an alcohol and drug abuse facility in Richmond, a letter from a patient in Coveseville, Va., etc.

Historical/Biographical Note

Dr. T. C. Miller practiced medicine in New Hope, VA from 1903 until 1925. He was born in 1873 in Rockingham County, attended Roanoke College and the Universal College of Medicine in Richmond. His office was in his residence where he lived with his wife, Lillie, and his daughter, Helen. He died in 1928 at the age of 55 and is buried in St. Paul's Chapel Cemetery at Weyers Cave, VA.
