The essays in this book draw on methods and findings from social history, archaeology, ethnic studies, and material culture studies to encompass key aspects and phases of the Virginia frontier experience. Among the topics covered are the earliest trade relationships between English settlers and Native Americans, the impact of immigrants from Ulster and the Rhineland, the nature of slavery in the region, development of community ties, and back country architecture.
