This book covers the history of Charlotte County, VA from the age of the Pleistocene Man through 1865. It details the formation of the county, the churches, modes of travel, everyday life, early leaders, historic homes, villages, and the Civil War years.

The Charlotte County Board of Supervisors funded the book. Research for the book was done by a group of twelve aided by county officials and librarians.

Organization/Arrangement

Chapters 1 – 6 are chronological from pre-historic times to 1765.
Chapters 7 – 17 are by topic.

Miscellaneous

There are extensive appendices listing county officers, ministers, state and federal representatives, pensioners, militia members, freed negroes, ordinaries and merchants, pedlars, bridges, ferries, and mills.
