# TURK McCleskey

Professor Turk McCleskey received his doctorate from The College of William and Mary in 1990 and joined the Virginia Military Institute faculty in 1994. His research and publications focus on the eighteenth-century colonial American frontier, especially Augusta County. His book, The Road to Black Ned's Forge: A Story of Race, Sex, and Trade on the Colonial American Frontier, is about the first free black landowner west of the Blue Ridge Mountains.
