Historical/Biographical Note

Point Pleasant was considered the first battle of the American Revolution. Forty-six persons were killed in the battle fought on October 10, 1774. Officers and ten privates have been identified. Twenty-four privates are still unknown. All were Virginians with the exception of Private James Mooney and Isaac Van Bibber from North Carolina. The youngest to die was Private William Stephen age 14.
