Scope & Content

- (1) The items related to the Second Presbyterian Church in Staunton cover the first seventy-five years of the church. A handwritten copy lists the names of the members in January 16, 1902. The 75th anniversary was celebrated November 12, 1950.
- (2) The photographs are of buildings taken in Atlanta Georgia about 1900.
- (3) Virginia First in the Heart of the Nation published in 1927 by the Chamber of Commerce depicts scenes of natural beauty throughout the state.

Historical/Biographical Note

Second Presbyterian Church was organized November 14, 1875. The charter members were from the First Presbyterian Church. The first place of worship was the old town hall on Beverley Street. The first church building was erected at Lewis and Frederick Streets in 1876 with the Rev. MacDuff Simpson as pastor. In 1901 the original church was torn down and a new one was constructed on the site. In 1902, the church had over 500 members.
